NEW RINK NEWS...

As you may have seen on our socials, IST—alongside your reps from IHT and FSAT met with the Department of State Growth and the consultants for the Feasibility Study on Friday 21st April. As always, this was a warm and collaborative spirit—and was to inform us about the progress of the report. Here is the summary from State Growth to outline the information shared at the meeting.....

"As you are aware Events Tasmania through the Department of State Growth is undertaking a feasibility study which will consider the economic viability and commercial opportunities of operating an ice rink within the state. A major focus of this has been around ensuring key stakeholders have the opportunity to provide input into the study. Events Tasmania has engaged Waypoint to assist them and to date we've provided them with participation data along with future facility needs and aspirations on behalf of our members. Waypoint and Events Tasmania thanked our members for their time and input and acknowledged the importance of gaining feedback from the Ice Sports community.

The next steps are to build on the information that the Ice Sports community has provided and undertake a public survey that will look at sport and entertainment consumption more broadly in Tasmania. The survey will look at demand, frequency of use, type of use (recreation versus sport), preparedness to travel to any new facility and price sensitivities. A sample of 1 000 people aged 16+ have been identified for this public survey and it is anticipated this will be undertaken over the next two weeks. We wanted to let you know that this public survey is happening and due to the random nature of this survey you may or may not be contacted."

Both the government representatives and the independent consultants asked that we pass on their **gratitude for your contributions** to their learning throughout the Feasibility Project. They were clear that your voices and needs have been heard and incorporated into their work.

IST is confident they will continue to listen and acknowledge the profound need and commitment in our community to a new ice sports facility and a strong and robust future for our existing and future local ice sports.

Every day without a local ice rink matters to our community.

This is a big project but is occurring within a collaborative relationship. IST is also appreciative of IHT and FSAT's presence in these meetings, as we all work together to make every effort to assist and contribute to get the best outcome for our sports.
