From Amy on the current focus for FSAT:


• Once again, many figure skaters continue to visit rinks interstate to train and keep up their strength and condition. This has included people who travel on their own, as well as another group of FSAT Members who participated in the second IST group trip in August to O'Brien Icehouse in Melbourne.



- Interstate our Figure Skaters are enjoying participating in Skate School lessons, attended figure sessions and private coaching lessons.
- The consistent feedback is that being back on the ice, participating in their sport and being together is very important to our athletes.

IHT have nearly completed their detailed strategic planning process, and in the next fortnight should have this complete, and will publish their 2022 to 2025 strategic plan soon after. Many in the Ice Hockey and Inline hockey community have been involved in collaboration to prepare this, and IHT would like to thank all that have assisted so far.

Wonderful things have been happening in our complimentary sport, Inline Hockey, where many of our Ice Hockey Players now play whilst we wait for a new rink:

- 1. The weekend of the 27th and 28th Woody's hosted a 3 on 3 Jamboree for juniors u11/u13 competition and u15/u17 competition. This was an amazing success with players coming from interstate to play. There were over 50 juniors participating!
- 2. Inline Hockey Tasmania for the first time in our Inline history are sending teams to all age divisions at the Australian Inline Nationals in late September, from U9s through to over 50s! 12 different divisions and over 150 players travelling to Brisbane later in September.

Finally, IHT junior Josh Mazengarb who is playing Ice Hockey in 17U in Victoria, his team Jets, made the finals with a win in the first of the best of three games played this past weekend! Congrats Josh and team!
